Dear Citizens,

Following the referendum of February 14, we took office at a time when the entire world was confronted by the Covid-19 pandemic, a pandemic that occurs once in a century. We managed the pandemic by securing vaccines and by vaccinating the majority of our citizens in record time, which made possible the reopening of the economy and its vigorous growth.

But not even a year passed when the energy crisis and the rise in the cost of living knocked on the door as a result of the war in Ukraine. The European continent hadn't seen such crises in the past fifty years. And, as if all of these global challenges weren't enough, during these four years we also faced internal challenges and obstacles.

Despite these, however, we made it, and we are becoming the first government to complete a full mandate. The global crises and challenges have now been overcome, and we will also overcome the internal challenges. And for this we need 500,000 hearts that beat to the same rhythm on February 9, throughout our country, corner to corner, so that our next mandate will be even stronger, and so that we can work even more quickly.

We inherited an economy of less than 7 billion euros, and we are completing our mandate with one of more than 10 billion euros.

We doubled national exports, as well as foreign direct investment. Capital investments marked a new record with 654 million euros disbursed in 2024.

The economy grew thanks to good budget management, but also due to increased employment. From the 350,000 workers that the economy had at the beginning of our mandate, it now has 430,000, and most of these additional workers are young people and women. This was achieved as a result of numerous measures whose main focus was the employment of women, youth, and non-majority communities.

This economic development, together with the success marked in the formalization of economic activity and the increase in citizens' confidence in the central government, resulted in an unprecedented increase in budgetary funds. Our government took care that these additional budgetary funds were disbursed in the best possible way.

We considerably increased support for businesses and farmers. We added to the budget for schools, hospitals, family medical centers, and medicines. We made education free for all. We built and renovated sports facilities and cultural heritage sites in Kosova, corner to corner. We increased public capital investments to levels never before reached. And we also increased funding for greater order, security, and sovereignty. We increased salaries in the public sector three times within our mandate, we raised the minimum wage, we increased pensions and social assistance, and we increased scholarships for students. For the first time we offered universal coverage for subsidies for over 400,000 children and around 70,000 new mothers.

We also promised justice and rule of law. With much success, we fought organized crime and corruption. Dozens of drug labs and illegal production of cyptocurrencies were shut down. Dozens of illegal roads were closed and order was established in every corner of our country's territory. We successfully stopped extreme abuse in public enterprises, and from enterprises that operated with continuous losses and overemployment based on party and politics, we have helped the majority of them achieve positive financial results. We implemented deep reform of the justice system. We made Kosova one of three states with the fastest progress in the world in justice reforms.

Thanks to the improvement of our state's global image and our engagement with skeptical states within the Schengen Zone, we secured freedom of movement without visas for our citizens, starting from January 1, 2024, making it possible for hundreds of thousands of families to freely visit our diaspora, and tens of thousands of young people to visit their favorite countries throughout Europe. We ensured that Kosova will organize the Mediterranean Games Prishtina 2030, making it the first country in the region that was offered the organization of such a large sports event.

In almost every area of engagement, we set records for success. Now, with a new governing mandate, we aim to break every record that we ourselves set.

We will accelerate economic growth with the support of productive enterprises and innovation.

We will increase salaries, pensions, and social assistance in line with the accelerated growth of the economy.

We will set new records for capital investment, with strategic projects that increase economic activity.

We will also ensure the creation of many new jobs, for youth, as well as for women, to meet the target of half a million workers by the end of our mandate.

We will take care for more security, justice, and equality, and for less crime, corruption, and poverty. We will continue our work for higher-quality education and health care.

We will work and be engaged toward more production and exports, support for the circular economy from production to the reprocessing of refuse, with greater energy security and lower environmental pollution.

We will also dedicate ourselves to higher quality of life and further increases in life expectancy.

We will work with our diaspora for the country's progress.

We will unreservedly support development projects for Albanians in Presheva, Medvegja, Bujanoc, and Sanxhak.

We will continue coordinating with the Republic of Albania, deepening joint projects, from energy, education, and defense, to foreign policy.

We are therefore presenting our 25 pledges, together with new programs that we haveplanned for our new mandate, which together with you, dear citizens, we will put into dynamic and comprehensive action to deepen progress, solidarity, justice, and the strengthening of our state.

PRODUCTION - ENTREPRENEURSHIP



Development Bank

Direct financing of strategic and priority projects will be supported through the Development Bank, while small and medium enterprises or even individuals will be supported via subloans through the banking sector for investments in priority areas, with the favorable conditions of the Development Bank.

At the same time, through letters of guarantee for payment, we will help producers and exporters gain easier access to financing and liquidity.

The "One Billion Euro for Production" Program

To create a sustainable economy with well-paid jobs, we will create a program for supporting investments in productive capacities, with a total of 1 billion euro, through the guarantee of loans for investors.

Each investor will be able to benefit from the guarantee that the state will provide for loans necessary for investment.

This will make it possible for investors to obtain far easier access to finance and far lower costs of financing. In addition, investors will also be able to benefit from schemes for subsidizing salaries.

Accelerated amortization for new investments

Through accelerated amortization, we will make possible, for all businesses that invest, the front-loading of the amortized value of investments in the early years, so that in these years tax obligations are lowered. This measure will solve the problem of liquidity during the early years of new investment in your businesses.



PUBLIC FINANCES



We have returned customs terminals to the state so that we do not have extortionate costs for foreign trade, and we are digitalizing fiscal registers to liberalize the market, lifting this unnecessary burden on businesses. We will continue this good work during our upcoming mandate, with the construction of a new digital system of electronic business-to-business invoices, a system that will enable real-time monitoring of VAT obligations, but at the same time enable the automatic reimbursement of businesses in loans, without lengthy VAT procedures.

To support business liquidity, we will relocate, from the border to inside the country, the collection of VAT for goods that enter through the border. The date of payment of the

VAT obligations will be pushed to the month following the one when the obligation at the border arose, similar to what businesses have for internal VAT.

For cars imported from Europe we will lift the customs duty of 10%, simplifying also the criteria for verification of origin, thereby lowering costs for citizens for the purchase of vehicles.



INNOVATION & TECHNOLOGY



Digital Currency of Kosova

We will begin this mandate with a Digital Currency of Kosova.

The digital currency, based on blockchain, and created by the state, will be used for payments. The creation of the digital currency will open new opportunities for innovation and create an ecosystem of innovators.

With this we will place Kosova at the center of the latest technological developments.

Support for the IT Industry

For companies in the field of information and communication technology that prove successful at increasing employment, we will design and build an ICT TOWER as a public investment at the center of the capital city, and we will also offer support for spaces in buildings in major cities.

We will remove all limitations on the recognition of training expenses as deductible expenses.



PUBLIC TRANSPORT




The "All Across" Transportation Program

Public transportation in our country is one of the areas that calls for much engagement and transformation.

Toward this aim we will begin by bringing into being the "All Across" Program.

We will thus create an integrated network of public transportation in the entire territory of the country, initially for intracity transportation, and continuing with intercity transportation. Integration will take place via an integrated monthly ticket. Each passenger will be able to travel all across Kosova, without needing another ticket, utilizing only intracity and intercity transportation.

The ticket will be subsidized, with a minimal cost for passengers. The aim is that, for an affordable cost of 10 euro per month, everyone will be able to take advantage of the "All Across" program.



BREZOVICA



BREZOVICA

We will begin this new mandate with the large "Brezovica" project.

We will invest up to 500 million euro in road infrastructure, modern accommodation, new slopes, and a contemporary cable-car network.

We will ensure that Brezovica becomes famous not only in the region but also in Europe and the world.

The development of this project will be brought to life through two components. The first component is the transport infrastructure, its construction and maintenance, whereas the second component will be the construction and operation of hotels, gastronomy, and recreational, sports, and other services.



DIASPORA



DIASPORA

Besides the initiatives that we undertook during our mandate, we will add efforts and programs that strengthen the participation of the diaspora in our country.

Through the "Window for Diaspora Investments," entrepreneurs from the diaspora will be supported with up to 100 million euro for investments made in Kosova.

Kosova's integration into SEPA will greatly ease the transfer of money to Kosova. In this way high tariffs will finally be eliminated and millions of euro of our diaspora's money will be saved.

Albanian language lessons, with a curriculum dedicated to the children of families that live and work outside the country. Together with Albania we will ensure that Albanian language lessons will be offered in all states with a large Albanian community.



FAMILY



FAMILY

We have supported families, from subsidies for electricity to subsidies for children, andduring the new mandate we are adding a new program for grandparents of every family that has children.

The "Generation for Generation" Program

As part of support for the family, we will begin a scheme for supporting retired grandparents that care for grandsons and granddaughters, in cases in which two parents works. Each retired grandmother or grandfather that cares for granddaughters and grandsons 13–36 months old, when the parents work, will receive an additional 100-euro subsidy every month, over and above their existing pension.

In addition to improving the welfare of retired grandparents, this program aims at the safeguarding and strengthening of the nuclear family, bringing together three generations of the family and simultaneously enabling women to integrate into the labor market.



WOMEN



WOMEN

Alongside measures that support girls in their studies, women in business, women with children, and female artists and athletes, during the first six months of our new mandate we will initiate a new program for the employment of women.

The "Super Work for Women" Program

The Super Work for Women Program will guarantee a minimum wage for the first six months, for every woman who wishes to return to the labor market. Thus, for businesses it will be profitable to employ women, because the state will pay their salary for the first six months, whereas for women it will be easier to find work.

This model has already proved successful in the case of young people, and we will expand it for all women as well.



WORKERS



WORKERS

Minimum Wage Increase

After increasing the minimum wage this mandate, we will continue to increase it in our new mandate.

During the upcoming mandate the minimum wage will be raised to over 500 euro. This same minimum wage will be exempt from taxation. This means that, for an individual small business, the first 6,000 euro of annual profits will be exempt from taxation.

Social Security Fund

We will establish a Social Security Fund through which pay for maternity and paternity leave, as well as payment in case of loss of employment, will be covered.

Labor Inspectorate

During this new mandate we will again increase the number of labor inspectors to 200.



STUDENTS



STUDENTS

In our first year we eliminated student fees, making public higher education free of charge.

"Mobility for Students" Scholarship Program

There a series of merit-based scholarship programs and strategic state priorities that we have implemented during the mandate that is being concluded.

In the new mandate we will add mobility scholarships and support for all students.

Thus, we will create a new "Mobility for Students" program that supports all students in need who complete their studies at a location other than the location where they live. Students who qualify for the "Mobility for Students" scholarship program, will receive a scholarship every month, depending on the distance between the place where they study and the place where they live.

Support for All Students

After we increased support for students in public universities and for women and girls studying STEM, we will also expand scholarship support for students studying at nonpublic universities. For this, we will double the scholarship budget from the one we currently have.



EDUCATION



Children's Education

We will continue to support early education as a high priority. Our country has 108,000 children 1-5 years of age. We will ensure that, along with increasing their inclusion in public preschools, we will also begin a system of bonds for those parents that decide to send their children to private preschools.

We also aim to include in the pre-elementary cycle all children from 5-6 years of age, totalling around 20.000 children.

Teaching

For graduates in the field of education, entering the profession will come after the licensing at the state level of every graduate in the case of applications for teaching positions at the pre-university level.

At the same time, advanced licensing of teachers at the superior level will be accompanied by an increase in their salary.

Schoolbooks

FWe will continue and deepen the process of review and reassessment of all schoolbooks. From language to mathematics, which we have reviewed already, we will continue with all other texts for the entirety of pre-university education. For some subjects, we will also begin with the translation and digitalization of educational materials.

Dual and Professional Education

For dual and professional education we will create a platform with profiles of each graduate of professional and dual education for access to the labor market. Ten new fields will be added to dual education, in response to industry demands, joining the twelve current fields.

We will continue to strengthen professional education with investments in educational tools, agreements with industry, and the fields in which pupils are taught.

Digitalization of the Learning Process

Digitalization of certificates and educational materials and the finalization of a centralized digital platform for the management of schools, registers, and digital educational materials are the next steps.

We will provide classrooms with smart tablets. We will expand high-speed broadband internet to pre-university educational institutions, together with free access to the internet.

Public Universities

We will support more and more programs for academic research in public universities.

In our new mandate public universities will be divided by subject areas, and we will begin budget planning based on performance evaluations.

In the Student Center of the University of Prishtina "Hasan Prishtina" we will construct a new dormitory and three new rooms for a university library inside the Student Center.



HEALTH



HEALTH

Every one of our citizens will have a family doctor, and will be in the Register for primary health care.

Health Insurance

After the entry into force of the new law on health insurance and the completion of the health information system, the path is open for the final operationalization of the health insurance system.

New Measures

In the new mandate we will completely decentralize health services. For this, in every regional hospital, we will invest in equipment, new services, and infrastructure. We will build new hospitals in Mitrovica and Ferizaj.

We will build specialist polyclinics in Drenas, Sharr, Podujeva, Vitia, Rahovec, and Leposaviq.

We will also open specialist dental polyclinics in Prishtina, Peja, Gjakova, Prizren, Gjilan, Mitrovica, Ferizaj, and Podujeva.

Furthermore, we will construct a network of public laboratories that cover all kinds of analyses at affordable prices.

Medicines

The list of reimbursable medicines will begin for the first time, supporting citizens on their expenses relating to out-of-hospital medicines.

For the List of Essential Medicines, we will ensure an increased budget of up to 100 million euro, while we have unified the prices of medicines in the entire territory of the country, with affordable prices.



AGRICULTURE



AGRICULTURE

In the mandate that we are completing, we turned Kosova's farmers into the most supported in the region. For this, we have as witnesses the 120,000 farmers who received over 300 million euro in grants and subsidies. Most importantly, subsidies went entirely to farmers, and abuses and misappropriations, which reigned in the past, have been put to an end.

In the new mandate our focus will be on increasing productivity and competitiveness through support for investments in technology and the networking of the collection and distribution of agricultural products.

We have subsidized the gasoline excise tax, and now we will also implement an insurance scheme against natural disasters for agricultural products.



WATER



WATER



Regarding the supply of drinking water, we will conclude the design and then the construction of the entire water supply network in all residential areas.

Security of Supply

To have security in the supply of water, work will begin on five new dikes in Kosova. Five reservoirs for drinking water, irrigation, and industry will be constructed, and we will prepare for four others as initial studies.

The reservoirs that will be built are the Lower Reservoir of Firaja, the Reservoir of Polluta, the Reservoir of Kuçica, the Reservoir of Dragaçina, and that of Desivojca.



ENERGY AND MINES

Generation Security

The affordability of prices, energy independence, and impact on health are primary in our energy policy.

Therefore, Kosova will have a mix of energy based on domestic sources, and increasingly clean and renewable sources from wind and solar. The "Kosova B" power plant will be modernized, while the "Kosova A" power plant will be deeply repaired, so as to increase supply security, and to reduce vulnerability to eventual crises from abroad.

We will intensify cooperation with Albania in building joint capacities.

We will also ensure that Kosova is at the forefront of technological developments in energy, adding to the energy mix non-traditional energy sources with innovative technologies from strategic partners.

Heating

We will build new central-heating systems in Ferizaj and Gjilan, whereas we will double the capacity and coverage of central heating in Prishtina.

Efficiency

We will continue investments in energy efficiency, in the amount of 150 million euro, for families in need of support to insulate their homes, and will ensure good conditions for pupils, patients, athletes, and officials in public buildings such as schools, hospitals, sports halls, etc. In this way we will secure better living conditions for citizens, heating at affordable prices, and reduction of the load on the electric energy network.

Mining

The mining sector is a strategic sector with importance for the economy and for national security. We will therefore establish a strategic partnership at the level of the state for joint research and investment in this sector. Trepça will be at the center of the sector, while research and investment will be expanded into other zones with high potential.



INFRASTRUCTURE

Railroads

In the new mandate we will begin the construction of the Prishtina-Durrës Railway, which includes the Gjakova-Shkodra segment, and we will design the rail line that links Prizren and Ferizaj with Gjilan and Bujanoc.

Roads

We will complete the construction of the Prizren-Tetova road, the Prishtina-Gjilan highway continuing to Dheu i Bardhë, and the Duhle-Shtime-Banulla Highway. In addition, we will build the Dukagjini road that links Prizren, Rahovec, Gjakova, and Deçan with Peja and Istog. And we will continue with the construction of the Deçan-Plava and Peja-Rozhaja roads.

The Dollc-Gjakova and Kijeva-Zahaq roads will be finalized along with the rehabilitation and modernization of all regional roads.

Dry Port

The construction of the dry port that puts Kosova on the Balkan map of transportation of goods is one of the large-scale projects that we will finalize.



CAPITAL PROJECTS

In the last two years of the mandate we broke records for the execution of capital investments, and we will accelerate this pace even further by reforming the public procurement system.

This will be achieved by ensuring efficient processes that bring value for money, so that the execution of capital investments surpasses 1 billion euro per year.

The next step after creating a system for tracking invoices, which ensures that every invoice is paid on time to economic operators, will be to complete the integration of the public finance management system with the e-procurement system. In this way we will ensure fiscal discipline, which prevents budgetary organizations from being placed under financial obligations without coverage.



MUNICIPALITIES



With the completion of the census, budgeting for municipalities will also be transformed.

The grants scheme will be adjusted according to census data, and the Fourth Grant will also be implemented, attached to the new, altered budgeting scheme of each municipality.

Budgeting based on census data will irreversibly transform the conditions and capacities for offering education, healthcare services, investments in urban and rural infrastructure, and that of water supply and sewage.

Along with a package of legislation for local government financing, we will also review the law on property taxes to complete the entire panoply of laws that secure financial resources for municipalities.



SPORT



SPORT

The Mediterranean Games 2030 are the key pillar for transforming Kosova into the sports epicenter of the region and beyond. The Palace of Youth and Sports and the Students Center in Prishtina will be converted into modern hospitality spaces, continuing to serve citizens for decades.

The plan for football infrastructure, including the National Stadium, the Aquatic Center with Olympic pools, as well as half-Olympic pools, will be the foundation of development and quality, whereas existing gymnasiums will be modernized according to international standards.

Through the program "Sport in Schools," we will combine sports with education and health, stimulating an active and healthy society.

We will continue to strengthen sports governance through transparency and accountability, for a sustainable and just system.



ART

Art and culture will be placed at the heart of state planning. The policy of the creative economy will be an aim of the next four years.

For creators and performers we continue to support independent artists and resident ensembles through financial security, creative autonomy, and the securing of dignified work spaces. We will connect artistic creativity with the labor market and ensure that cultural products receive due

With the continuation of the "Art in Schools" program in the entire country, the education of the audience, identification of artistic talents, and integration of culture into the everyday life of society will continue. Every child will have access to cultural activities.

In the second mandate as well, we will continue to modernize cultural buildings, transforming them into contemporary centers of creation and interaction.

Large-scale projects such as the Opera and Ballet Theater and the Contemporary Art Museum will become global reference points, offering worthy spaces for creativity and international collaborations.



CULTURAL HERITAGE



The first mandate was that of rescuing monuments. In the new mandate, for cultural heritage, we will pass from physical protection to operationalization. We will place monuments in service of the community and economy. Along with the preservation of the history of strengthening identity, we will turn heritage into a contributor to social welfare.

Archeology will remain a high priority through investments in excavation, study, and management, whereas we will continue to make archeological zones state property. Kosova's historical centers will be revived in the service of tourism, in coordination with the residents and businesses of these zones.

The program for museums begun in the first mandate will be expanded to multiple municipalities, with the operationalization of existing museums and the establishment of new museums. Along with the drafting of the master plan, we will take care to begin conservation works in Prekaz, in the Towers of Resistance inside the Adem Jashari Memorial Complex, as the place with the most sublime symbol of the war of liberation and the Commander of the Kosova Liberation Army.

Religious heritage will receive special treatment through documentation and promotion. The policy of integrated conservation will be our guide in the second mandate, with heritage being an integral part of spatial and development planning.



JUSTICE



Family Court

Cases such as property, inheritance, violence in the family, divorce, and alimony cannot wait a decade to be resolved. Family problems must be resolved quickly and effectively. Our response will be the establishment of a Family Court, which will handle with priority and expeditiousness cases that citizens address to the court.

Special Prosecution for the Fight against Organized Crime and Corruption

We will establish a new Special Prosecution for organized crime and corruption cases, with the support and example of countries in Europe that have finished this battle with success.

There is nothing more important for justice than that investigative institutions be on duty regarding criminal networks that are continuously organized against the state and justice as a whole.

Establishment of the Office of Disciplinary Investigations

The Office of Disciplinary Investigations will be a new structure that guarantees effective checks and balances between powers, increasing the accountability of the Kosova Judicial Council and the Kosova Prosecutorial Council for their actions.

The Office will be responsible for handling complaints and claims of inappropriate behavior by judges and prosecutors. The disciplinary process will be able to be initiated ex officio as well. The Office will conduct the gathering of evidence and the presentation of cases before the Disciplinary Committees of the KJC and KPC.



SECURITY



SECURITY

During our new mandate we will continue our work for law and order in the entire country, corner to corner. Along with the fight against organized crime, capacities and programs for public safety will be added. Safety on the streets, as well as in schools, and community policing, are a priority of our new mandate.

We will continue to support the Police and security institutions with specialized and contemporary equipment, with education and training, and with adequate arms.

We will advance the Drone and Antidrone Unit to reinforce monitoring and readiness to confront new kinds of security threats, aiding in investigations, defense, and monitoring of the border, as well as increasing public safety in general.

The country will have secure borders managed by the most advanced technologies. The National Center for Border Management will be modernized to guarantee safety, facilitate the movement of goods and persons, and prevent criminal activities.



DEFENSE



We will allocate a budget of over 1 billion euro for our military in the next four years.

We will deepen and expand bilateral and multilateral international cooperation with NATO members states.

Operationalization of the Munitions Factory and the development of Kosova's military industry.

During our new mandate we will develop "Made in Kosova" military drones.

The strengthening of the military will be realized through arms purchases, training, and education inside the country, in cooperation with Albania and the most distinguished military academies in partner countries.

We will create a joint military unit with the Armed Forces of the Republic of Albania.

The recruitment of new cadets will continue at a faster pace. We aim to have 1,000 women and qirls as soldiers within our new mandate.

The Comprehensive Defense Program will be implemented in the entire country. In the framework of this program every volunteer reservist will receive adequate training, as well as arms in the case of mobilization.



FOREIGN POLICY AND EUROPEAN INTEGRATION



Foreign Policy

We will strengthen even further the strategic relations of our country with partners.

The further strengthening of the passport of the Republic of Kosova in all continents is one of our aims along with achieving bilateral relations for the removal of the visa regime. This development will create new economic, trade, cultural, and educational opportunities for citizens of the country.

Attaining candidate status for the European Union will be one of our key engagements.

Doubling of the network of defense attachés and an increase in partner states with which we sign SOFA agreements are steps forward that we will take toward full membership in NATO.

We will expand and deepen bilateral relations with non-recognizing states, with a special emphasis on the non-recognizing states of NATO, the European Union, and the Council of Europe.

We aim to lead at least one regional initiative and to organize important regional conferences and summits in the framework of integrating the six Western Balkan states into the European Union.

The further strengthening of capacities of the Diplomatic Service and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Diaspora for fighting disinformation generated and spread by the axis of authoritarian states in our region, Europe, and in other continents.

We will further open the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Diplomatic Service to new cadres of our country and our diaspora.

We will establish a network of economic and trade attachés as a mechanism for the identification and attraction of outside investments and the discovery of new markets for the export of domestic products.

We will also act in the same way with the network of cultural attachés for the promotion of our country's art and culture, creating new opportunities for artists and art students.

European Union Integration

As the most advanced democracy in the region, with continuous economic growth, fully harmonized with EU foreign policy and a bearer of EU values, our vision is to prepare the country to face the pressure of regional and European market competition and to move forward in Euro-Atlantic integration processes.

On December 15, 2022, we officially submitted our application for European Union membership, with the aim of obtaining candidate status. Our aim, by 2030, is for our country to have successfully concluded all chapters from the integration process, toward EU membership.


